NARRATIVE TITLE: ACTION TAKEN - Sgt Campbell		
<p>NARRATIVE:</p> <p>On 07/01/2011, at approximately 0030 hours, I responded to 2160 Lawson Creek Road for a reported vehicle fire.</p> <p>I arrived on scene with Officer Dolan. A car port across from 2160 Lawson Creek was completely engulfed in flames. The entire car port was on fire and it did not appear at though the fire had started on only one end. There were multiple cars under the car port that were also engulfed in fire. I told Officer Dolan to start taking photographs, and to photo the people in the area. I then directed the fire trucks to the scene.</p> <p>Once the fire trucks were on scene I began evacuating the apartments to the right of the car port, as to you face it from the street. The structure was three stories high with the two upper apartments accessed by a back street. I directed Officer Dolan to go to the back street and evacuate the upper apartments. While Officer Dolan and I were evacuating the apartments to the right of the car port, Officer Colon began evacuating the apartments across from the car port.</p> <p>Once the apartments were evacuated I had the officers maintain a perimeter to keep spectators at a safe distance. Officer Dolan and I were positioned to the right of the car port, and Officer Colon and Officer Warnaca were position to the left of the car port.</p> <p>I contacted Dispatch and was told that the original caller for the fire was [REDACTED] who lives in [REDACTED]. I had dispatch attempt to contact [REDACTED] by telephone and the line went straight to voicemail. I later heard Officer Warnaca run a person check on [REDACTED]. I contacted Officer Warnaca via telephone, who was maintaining the perimeter to the opposite side of the fire, and told him to conduct an initial recorded interview with [REDACTED]. I also instructed Officer Warnaca to take photographs of the people gather at his end of the fire scene.</p> <p>I spoke with Sgt Paul Hatch via telephone and informed him of the fire. I also contacted Lt Wilson via telephone to update him on the incident.</p> <p>I also spoke with CCFR Fire Marshal Dan Jager, who was in charge of the fire scene. Fire Marshal Jager said that the fire appeared suspicious because all the gas doors to the burned cars were open. Fire Marshal Jager said that CCFR Chief Etheridge was in route to assist with processing the fire scene. I instructed Officer Colon and Officer Warnaca to contain the fire scene with crime scene tape.</p> <p>I have nothing further to add to this report. Case forwarded to the CIU for follow up.</p>

<p>NARRATIVE: SUPPLEMENTAL REPORT</p> <p>07/01/11, I assisted Capital City Fire and Rescue (CCFR) with a fire on Lawson Creek Road.</p> <p>I was directed to the South side of the complex to assist with photographing onlookers. While there, I was approached by a man, who identified himself verbally as [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was sitting on a kennel that contained two cats, and he had two dogs who were sitting next to him. While I was speaking with [REDACTED] he appeared shaky and nervous.</p> <p>INTERVIEW: [REDACTED]</p> <p>In a digitally recorded interview [REDACTED] told me, in essence, the following:</p> <p>My truck was the first one to the left inside of the carport. I was just tossing and turning and I couldn't sleep. I was just laying there and I was wondering why there was so much light coming into my place. I thought it was really bright. It looked like a car was pulling into the parking lot. I looked and saw a car on fire. It was the car next to my truck, on the right side. The first thought I had was to move my truck, but I thought, "No, I'd better call this in." So, I called. I was frenzied. But the thing of it was, I could have saved my truck if I didn't call it in. It felt like the fire trucks took a long time to get here, it took like 10 minutes for them to get here, it was too long. They come from Douglas.</p> <p>I could have saved my truck if I didn't call this in. I didn't see anything strange today. Yesterday, I was smoking cigarettes in my truck, but I didn't smoke any cigarettes today whatsoever in a 24 hour period. There were cigarettes in my ashtray so I cleaned out the ashtray. I put water in the ashtray and cleaned it up and it's on the counter today, where it is still.</p> <p>I haven't had anything to drink today. I haven't had anything in cigarettes and I haven't had anything in beer today.</p> <p>Did anyone else call this in? Capitol City Fire and Rescue (CCFR) had already arrived and were battling the blaze. Concerned that the fire would spread to the building directly across it, I began evacuating residence from their apartments. She said she, that on 06-31-11 at 1700 hours, she conducted an out inspection with former tenant [REDACTED] who is in the Coast Guard, at apartment [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said as she arrived at the apartment, [REDACTED] and another unidentified male were next to the vehicle and looking at it. After the inspection, [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that he would be moving the car within the next half hour. [REDACTED] took a photo of the vehicle under the carport, because she was concerned that the vehicle would be left there. [REDACTED] sent me a copy of the photo for this case.</p> <p>On 07-01-11, I received a telephone call from [REDACTED] [REDACTED]. She told me that last night, at about 2230 hours, she saw a blue pickup with Florida plates parked out front of the carport that caught on fire. [REDACTED] said she had never seen the vehicle there. [REDACTED] said she also saw the lights on in [REDACTED] [REDACTED] [REDACTED], and she believed the former tenant had moved out earlier that day.</p> <p>On 07-01-11, at about 1000 hours, Sgt. Hatch and I met with Fire Marshall Jaeger at the area of 2160 Lawson Creek Road.</p> <p>Fire Marshal Jager told me that about an hour ago, he was at 2160 Lawson Creek Road and noticed that the gas cap spring from AK # EYW288 ([REDACTED] vehicle) was lying on the ground outside the vehicle; on the same side as the gas cap lid. The gas cap lid was also open. Several other vehicles that caught fire had their gas cap lids open, although the springs for the gas caps were still inside the vehicle, on the opening of the gas tank.</p> <p>Fire Marshal Jager felt this was suspicious and believed the gas cap for AK # EYW288 might have been removed prior to the fire. The plastic gas caps for all the vehicles were melted, but the metal springs were left behind.</p> <p>Sgt. Hatch and I conducted a canvass of the nearby residences in an attempt to identify anyone as an eye witness, and to further ascertain leads or suspects. He did not remember his license plate number.</p> <p>[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] LNU sent him a text message approximately one month ago asking to buy back the Mustang.
